## The Conductor

It is fitting in this the Sesquicentennial Year in Indiana that Dr. William D. Revelli returns to Indiana, the State from which he launched his career as band director. Few directors have influenced the standards and development of high school and college bands as has Dr. Revelli. As the director of bands at Hobart High School he established performance standards which still affect today's activities.

In the band profession he is considered the Dean of College and University Band Directors. As he influenced the high school bands in Indiana, so has he influenced the college bands throughout the country since assuming the directorship of the University of Michigan Bands.

Dr. Revelli is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, Past President of the College Band Directors National Association, and has served the Music Educators National Association in numerous research and committee assignments.

Under his direction the University of Michigan Bands have achieved international fame. In 1963 the band toured Europe and Russia on a cultural exchange program under the sponsorship of our State Department.

The Indiana Bandmasters Association is pleased to have Dr. William D. Revelli as the conductor of the 1966 All-State High School Band.
