#### THE CONDUCTORS

Dr. John Colbert is Conductor of the Symphonic Band and Wind Ensemble and Chairman of the Department of Music Education, Jordan College of Fine Arts, Butler University. Dr. Colbert received the Diploma in Trumpet from Cincinnati Conservatory of Music and the B.S. in Music Education from the University of Cincinnati. The Masters of Music Education, the Professional Diploma and the Doctor of Education in Music and Music Education were earned at Columbia University, Teachers College in New York City. Graduate study was taken at the Juilliard School of Music.

Dr. Colbert is an active member of the American Bandmasters Association and member of the Research and Education Committee of the College Band Directors National Association. He has served as President of the Indiana Bandmasters Association and as President and Secretary-Treasurer of Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu. Dr. Colbert has been elected to honorary membership in Kappa Kappa Psi and is a life member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. Memberships are held in the Music Educators National Conference, Indiana Music Educators Association and Pi Kappa Lambda.

Dr. Colbert has played trumpet professionally with the Radio City Music Hall Symphony Orchestra and the National Orchestra Association Symphony in New York City. He has also played with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, the Louisville Philharmonic, the Cincinnati Summer Opera, the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra and the Jimmy James Band.

He has served as adjudicator at contests and festivals in sixteen states. His articles have been published in the <u>Journal of Research in Music Education</u>, the <u>Music Educators Journal</u>, the <u>Indiana Musicator</u>, and the <u>School Musician</u>
Director and Teacher.

Dr. James Neilson, Director of the Educational Department of the G. Leblanc Corporation is responsible for writing, editing and supervising the preparation of all educational and recruiting aids published by Leblanc. Dr. Neilson is a Leblanc staff conductor in all fields, choral as well as band and orchestra, and is a lecturer on music subjects. Dr. Neilson has been guest conductor of many famous bands, including the United States Navy Band, the Air Force Band, and many outstanding university and high school bands.

Dr. Neilson was for twenty-five years a professor of music education of Oklahoma City University as well as being its Director of Musical Organizations, in which capacity he conducted the University Symphonic Band, Symphony Orchestra, Opera Workshop productions, University Choirs and the famous OCU Surrey Singers. He is known as one of the outstanding music educators in the nation, and is in constant demand as a guest conductor, clinician, adjudicator and lecturer on college campuses and at music clinics and meetings throughout the United States.

Educated at the Chicago Musical College and the Juilliard School of Music. Dr.Neilson was awarded an honorary Doctor of Music Degree by McMurray College, Abilene, Texas. His professional affiliations include Phi Mu Alpha, of which he is a life member; the College Band Directors National Association, of which he is past president; the Music Educators National Conference; the National Association for American Composers and Conductors; and the National Music Council. He is an active member of the American Bandmasters Association, and was appointed a member of the original National Music Council-Ford Foundation Committee for placing young composers in school systems.
