## THE CONDUCTORS

PAULA A. CRIDER is in her fourteenth year as Director of Bands at Crockett High School in Austin, Texas. The 250 member Crockett band program has a record of thirteen consecutive "Sweepstakes" Awards for excellence in University Scholastic League marching, concert and sight-reading competition.

The Crockett Symphonic Band has twice been selected "Best in Class" at the Six Flags Invitational Concert Festival, and in 1980 and again in 1981 the Crockett Marching Band earned the highest honor awarded a marching band in the State of Texas -- "Best in Class AAAAA" at the Texas State Marching Contest.

In 1976 the Crockett Band was selected to represent the State of Texas in the Bicentennial Grand Parade in Washington, D.C., and in 1978 the Crockett Symphonic Band performed as guest band at the National Bandmaster's Convention in Knoxville, Tennessee.

Ms. Crider has served as both clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States. She is a member of the Texas Music Educator's Association, Tau Beta Sigma, Mu Phi Epsilon and Phi Alpha Lambda. She has been named as a charter member of the Texas Music Adjudicator's Association, and is currently serving as High School Representative on the Board of Directors of the National Bandmaster's Association.

COLONEL ARNALD D. GABRIEL, dynamic young conductor of The United States Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra, and The Singing Sergeants in Washington, D.C.

Since assuming his present position as Commander and Conductor of the premiere musical organization of the U.S. Air Force in 1964, Colonel Gabriel has instituted a new tour concept for The U.S. Air Force Band and Singing Sergeants which presents concerts as a public service without admission charge. Tours under his concept have been overwhelming successes.

In 1966 Colonel Gabriel created the Band's highly acclaimed Guest Artist Series; which has since been presented annually on Sunday afternoons in February and March in the Nation's Capitol.

In August, 1969, he was awarded the first CITATION OF EXCELLENCE ever presented by the National Band Association. This prestigious award was created by the NBA "to recognize the efforts of individuals who have made outstanding contributions toward the development of the musical and educational significance of bands and band music."

On December 22, 1973, he was awarded the Gold Medal of Honor for Distinguished Service to Music Education by the Mid-West National Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, Illinois.

In March, 1978, he was elected Vice-President of the American Bandmasters Association, in 1979 he assumed the position of President-Elect, and in March, 1980, at the annual convention of the ABA, he became President of this prestigious association.
