Gene Thrailkill

Gens Thrailkill is Regents' Professor and Professor of Music at The University of Oklahoma. He also serves as Director of University Bands and heads the extensive OU band program.

A native of Peoria, Illinois, Thrailkill joined the Oklahoma faculty in 1971 and, along with his duties as coordinator of the eight bands in the OU program, is director of the famed 290 member Pride of Oklahoma Marching Band. The Pride of Oklahoma was awarded the coveted Sudler Trophy in 1987 as the nation's most outstanding college and university marching band. More than 600 students are enrolled in the total band program at OU.

Thrailkill came to Okishoma from Ohio University at Athens where he had been Director of Banda from 1967-71. He holds a bachelor of music degree from the University of Michigan and a master of music education degree from Ohio University. Prior to 1967, he served as director of instrumental music for the New Lebanon (Ohio) Public School System.

In addition to the bend program, he teaches instrumental music education, serves on University committees and is presently serving on numerous education committees in Oklahoma and nationally. In 1966 he was named Regents' Professor, the highest faculty honor on the Oklahoma campus. He has been the recipient of the Associates Distinguished Lectureship awarded by the University of Oklahoma Board of Regents. He has been awarded the Administrator of the Year, the Walter Neustadt Award, and has been recognized by honorary membership in the Gold Key National Honorary for his contributions to OU students. In 1990 he was honored by the Ohio University School of Music with their "Outstanding Alumni" Award.

Throllkill established the Oklahoma All-Star Marching Band, now in its eighteenth summer. The membership of 300 high school students represents 150 schools from the state of Oklahoma.

He is a local advisor and past district governor of Kappa Kappa Psi Honorary Band fraternity, a member of the American Bandmasters Association, College Band Directors National Association, and the National Band Association. Thrailkill was voted the Oklahoma Bandmasters Association Bandmaster of the Year in 1988, and was inducted into the Oklahoma Bandmasters Hall of Fame in 1991.

Thrailkill serves as guest conductor and climician for concert and marching bands throughout the nation.

He and his wife Karen have three children, Stacy, Dawn, and Chad.

Colonel John R. Bourgeois

Colonal John R. Bourgeois, USMC (Ref), was Director of "The President's Own" United States Marine Band from 1979 to 1996.

During his nearly 40 years with the Marine Band, Colonel Bourgeois served nine presidential administrations — from Presidents Eisenhower to Clinton. As Director for 17 years, he regularly conducted the Marine Band and the Marine Chamber Orchestra at the White House, appearing there more frequently than any other musician in the nation.

A native of Louisiana, Colonel Bourgeois is a graduate of Loyola University in New Orleans. He joined "The President's Own" in 1958 as a french homist and arranger, was named Assistant Director in 1974, Director in 1979, and was promoted to Colonel in 1983. He retired in 1996.

Throughout his career, Colonel Bourgeois has been a leader in the international band community. He is past president of the American Bandmasters Association, chairman of the board and past president of the National Band Association, a past member of the board of directors of the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, and American vice-president of the International Military Music Society. He is a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, the Military Order of the Carabao, the Alfalfa and Gridiron Clubs of Washington, the College Band Directors National Association, and an honorary Life Member of the Texas Bandmasters Association. He is a visiting professor in a chair endowed in his name at Loyola University in New Orleans.

He is the president of the John Philip Sousa Foundation and his affinity for Sousa's work has earned him the Sudler Medal for outstanding service to bands at the international level. In 1993 he was awarded the Medal of Honor of the Mid-west International Band and Orchestra Clinic and the Medal of the International Percy Grainger Society. In addition, he was awarded Phi Beta Mu's Outstanding Bandmaster Award in 1986; the Distinguished Service to Music Medal by Kappa Kappa Psi in 1987; the National Band Association's Academy of Wind and Percussion Artists Award in 1990; Phi Mu Alpha Sinfenia's National Citation for "service to music and dedication to music and country" in 1991; and in 1996 he was awarded the Austin Harding Award of the American School Band Directors Association.

He has conducted the Sousa International High School Honors Band since its inception in 1981. He was also selected to conduct the first International Youth Wind Orchestra at the 1987 conference of the World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles. In 1994 he was invited to conduct the Louisiana Philharmonic and is a frequent guest conducter of bands and orchestras across America and around the world.

He is currently expanding the hand repertory through arranging and editing a series known as the "Bourgeois Editions," published by Wingert Iones. When he is not busy with myriad musical activities, Colonel Bourgeois devotes time to restoring his Capitol Hill townhouse, collecting Napoleana, and spending time at his cabin in Washington, Virginia. He also enjoys cooking, in particular his native Cajun cuisine.
