201 IBA All-State Band Guest Conductor Alfred Watkins

Alfred L. Watkins was Director of Bands at Lassiter High School for 31 years. For six years prior to joining Lassiter, Watkins served as Director of Bands at Murphy High School in the Atlanta Public Schools. Mr. Watkins is a graduate of Florida A & M University where he was a conducting and music education student of Dr. William P. Foster and Dr. Julian E. White. Bands under Watkins' direction have performed four times at the *Midwest Band Clinic*, six performances at the Bands Of America National Concert Band Festival and four performances at the Georgia Music Educators Association In-Service Conference. The symphonic band has performed on the college campuses of the University of Georgia (4), Florida State University, the University of South Carolina and

Troy State University. The Lassiter Flute Choir, Clarinet Choir, Trumpet Ensemble, Trombone Choir, and Percussion Ensemble have all performed on the national stage. The Lassiter Percussion Ensemble has performed twice at the Midwest Clinic, PASIC, three times at the National Percussion Festival and four times at the Georgia Music Educators Association In-Service Conference.

The Lassiter Marching Band was the 1998 and 2002 *Bands of America Grand National Champion* and the band also won nine BOA Regional Championships. Under Watkins' leadership, the band also participated in four *Tournament of Roses Parades*, three times in the *Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade*, twice in the *Orange Bowl Parade* and once in the *Florida Citrus Bowl Parade*. During Mr. Watkins' Lassiter tenure, all four (or five) Lassiter concert bands received consecutive Superior Ratings from 1993 until his retirement in 2013, with the top two bands earning consistent superior ratings in Grade VI for his last 24 years. The band program is one of only fourteen high bands in America to have received



both the *Sudler Flag of Honor* for concert and the *Sudler Shield* for marching. The Lassiter Winter Color Guard was named 1996 and 1997 Winter Guard International World Champions.

Mr. Watkins has been selected as a member of the Florida A & M University Gallery of Distinguished Alumni, the American Bandmasters Association, the Georgia Chapter of the Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame and the Bands of America Hall of Fame. He has received seventeen Certificates of Excellence from the National Band Association, the Sudler Order of Merit from the John Philip Sousa Foundation and the Band World Magazine Legion of Honor. In 2002, he was honored in the U.S. House of Representatives Congressional Record for his outstanding achievement. Mr. Watkins is Co-Founder, Conductor and Musical Director of the Cobb Wind Symphony, an alladult community band based in the Atlanta area, which in 2009, earned the Sudler Silver Scroll Award presented to outstanding community bands in America and has performed twice at the Midwest Clinic. The \$1.5 million Alfred L. Watkins Band Building at Lassiter High School bears his name. In 2009 and 2010, two doctoral dissertations were written (Sue Samuels, Auburn University and Matt Thomas, FSU) centered around his life and work surrounding the Lassiter Band Program. In 2013, he was awarded the Distinguished Career Award from GMEA. In 2014, Watkins' former students and friends commissioned composers Mark Camphouse and James Curnow to write works honoring Mr. Watkins and his career: "Second Essay for Symphonic Band" and "Lexus for Solo Trumpet, Winds and Percussion." In 2014, Watkins received the Edwin Franko Goldman Award from the American School Band Directors Association for outstanding contribution to the advancement of school bands. Currently, Mr. Watkins serves on the Midwest Clinic Advisory Committee. He and his wife for 33 years, Rita, live in Marietta. They have two adult sons.

2017 IBA All-State Honor Band Guest Conductor Major Michelle Rakers

Assistant Director Major Michelle A. Rakers joined "The President's Own" United States Marine Band in May 1998 as a trumpeter/cornetist. She was appointed Assistant Director and commissioned a first lieutenant in July 2004 and promoted to captain by Commandant of the Marine Corps General Michael W. Hagee on Jan. 1, 2006. She was promoted to major and appointed Executive Officer and Senior Assistant Director in July 2014. She is both the first female Assistant Director and first female commissioned officer in the history of "The President's Own."

With the Marine Band, Major Rakers has performed at the White House, in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area, and across the country during the band's annual concert tour. As an advocate for education outreach, she led



the band's Music in the Schools, Music in the High Schools, and Concerto Competition programs from 2007-14. Additionally, she served as a conductor and supervisor for the acclaimed fall and winter Chamber Music Series, which feature the virtuoso musicians of "The President's Own."

Major Rakers, a 1986 graduate of the Marian Heights Academy in Ferdinand, Ind., received a bachelor's degree in music management from the University of Evansville in Indiana in 1990. She continued her studies at Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill., where she earned a master's degree in trumpet performance in 1991. She received a doctorate from the Peabody Conservatory of the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Md., in 2015 where she studied with Harlan Parker. She also studied conducting with Mallory Thompson of Northwestern University and Kate Tamarkin of The Catholic University in Washington, D.C. Her trumpet instructors included James Bursen of the University of Evansville, Vincent Cichowicz of Northwestern University, and Chris Gekker of the Aspen Music Festival

in Colorado. Prior to joining "The President's Own," Major Rakers enjoyed an active career as an orchestral trumpeter, having performed with many orchestras nationally to include the Evansville Philharmonic in Indiana, the Owensboro Symphony in Kentucky, and the Kalamazoo Symphony in Michigan.

She was nominated as an Assistant Director in 2003, and on June 13, 2004, she conducted her first band concert at the U.S. Capitol. During her tenure as an Assistant Director with "The President's Own," Major Rakers has been very active as a guest conductor, clinician, and public speaker, having worked with all-state and honor festivals and offered workshops at the Sibelius Academy of Helsinki, Finland, and universities throughout the United States. Major Rakers has also appeared as a guest conductor with bands and orchestras throughout the nation, and internationally with the Slesvigske Musikkorps of Haderslev, Denmark, the Helsinki Guards Band, Finland, and the National Youth Brass Band of Great Britain. In 2009 she received the University of Evansville's Distinguished Alumni Award and was granted an honorary induction into Tau Beta Sigma, a national music sorority.

2017 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Bandmaster Tom Dean

Born in Danville, IL (1966), Tom Dean was attracted to music early in his life by watching and listening to his mother play piano at home and church. He later learned to play the trumpet in the Castle public school system under the direction of Jack Schernekau and Phi Beta Mu members Tom Listenfelt and Jerry Reese. After graduating from Castle High School in 1984, Mr. Dean studied Music Education at Ball State University and was heavily influenced by two Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame members - Dr. Joseph Scagnoli, Director of Bands at Ball State University and Mr. Bob Shauver, Director of Bands at New Castle Chrysler High School. Mr. Dean was

appointed the high school band director at Eastbrook High School from 1988-1991, where he taught with fellow Phi Beta Mu member, John Brane. From 1991-1993, he worked in a graduate assistant position at Bowling Green State University, Ohio assisting with the marching band, concert bands and undergraduate conducting classes. While at BGSU, he earned his Master's Degree with a conducting emphasis studying with Mr. Mark Kelly and met his eventual wife, Jill. After earning his Master's Degree, Mr. Dean returned to Castle High School in 1993 and was named the Head Director in 1994. He has been privileged to teach at Castle High School with Phi Beta Mu members Glenn Northern and Mark Eifler. He lives in Newburgh, Indiana with his wife, Jill, and daughters, Morgan and Olivia.

Under his leadership, the Castle High School wind ensemble has been named an ISSMA State Finalist 14 times and has been selected to perform at the Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference. The marching band has been named an Indiana Class A State Finalist 15 times, was a 2016 Bands of America Grand National Finalist,



and was awarded the 2016 Sudler Shield Award from the John Phillip Sousa Foundation. During his tenure, the Castle High School Band has traveled and performed at many prestigious contests and events throughout the country, but he is proudest of the many talented and hardworking students that he has taught through the years.


Mr. Dean is a member of several professional musical organizations, has served 15 years as a member of Indiana State School Music Association State Board, was awarded an Eli Lilly Teacher Creativity Award, received the 2003 Ball State University Alumni Achievement Citation and is now serving as the Indiana State School Music Association past president.



Phi Beta Mu is the highest honorary international band director's fraternity. It was organized to encourage the building of better bands and the development of better musicians in schools throughout the world and to foster deeper appreciation of good music and more wide spread public interest. Gamma Chapter of Phi Beta Mu was organized and the charter members initiated on November 27, 1953, at the state convention of the Indiana Music Educators Association.

2017 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame Dr. Daniel P. Bolin

Dr. Daniel Bolin is an Associate Professor of Music at the Jordan College of the Arts, Butler University where he served as Chair of the School of Music from 1995 to 2001 and again from 2009 to 2014. He received his B.M. and M.M. degrees from Butler and his Ed.D. from Indiana University. Prior to his appointment at Butler, he was an administrator in the Metropolitan School District of Perry Township serving as Assistant Principal at Southport High School, Director of Secondary Education, Assistant Superintendent and Interim Superintendent.



During his career in music education Dr. Bolin served as band director at Wood High School and Manual High School in the Indianapolis. He also developed outstanding bands at Lebanon and Southport High Schools. His bands at Southport were selected to perform for the IMEA Conference, the ASBDA National Convention, and were twice honored by Butler by performances in Clowes Hall. In 1977 he was elected into the ASBDA and selected as the Outstanding Young Band Director for Indiana. In 1981 he co-founded the Great Lake Music Camps which served middle school and high school musicians for 23 years.

Additional activities included service as the executive secretary of the IMFA. He was on the board of ISMA and was secretary of the merger committee that created ISSMA and has served on numerous boards including (Chairman) Young Audiences of Indiana, Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra, Perry Township Educational Foundation among others. Dr. Bolin has served as a presenter to new music school administrators for the

National Association of Schools of Music on three occasions and is a visiting evaluator for NASM accreditation.

His performing background includes the Philharmonic Orchestra of Indianapolis, the Carmel Symphony Orchestra, and principal tuba with the Indianapolis Symphonic Band. He has serves as an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor throughout the United States and for Festivals at Sea.

Dr. Bolin studied conducting with Dr. John Colbert and Dr. Charles Henzie during his undergraduate work at Butler and has attended graduate conducting workshops with some of America's foremost wind band conductors including Dr. William D. Revelli, H. Robert Reynolds, Frank Battisti, Col. William Santleman, and Frederick Fennell. He has guest conducted The United States Army Band, The United States Coast Guard Band, The United States Air Force Band, The United States Air Force Band, The United States Air Force Academy Band, The United States Air Force Band of Flight, and The United States Army Field Band. In 2007 Dr. Bolin was selected as the Director of the Indianapolis Municipal Band.

Dr. Bolin was awarded the United States Army Civilian Public Service medal by the commander of The United States Army Field Band, and has been recognized by "Who's Who in America." He has held membership in the CBDNA, IBA, ASBDA, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi, Phi Delta Kappa, Pi Kappa Lambda, Phi Beta Mu, MENC, IMEA and is currently serves on the Board of Directors of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association.

Dan is married to the former Jane Crecelius. He has two sons John (Lucy) and Douglas. He has two grandchildren, Ale and Liam.

Indiana Bandmasters Association

Purpose

- 1. To stimulate interest in the study of the band and its literature.
- 2. To develop a desire for good band literature.
- 3. To encourage good fellowship between the members of the Association.
- 4. To bring the work of the Association before the Indiana Department of Education and the citizens of the State in order that it shall gain greater recognition and support.
- 5. To provide educational meetings for band directors to raise the standards of instruction.
- 6. To secure recognition of School Administrators and Boards of Education to the effect that the band is an integral part of the school curriculum and is entitled to recognition as a curricular subject.
- 7. To develop a band in each community which shall serve as a vital force in bringing people into closer relationship with the schools of the State.

History

Founded in 1953, the Indiana Bandmasters Association would initially engage in sponsoring a Marching Band Clinic, an All-State Band, and act in an advisory capacity for Indiana Music Education Association (IMEA) on band activities. The first Marching Band Clinic was organized in the fall of 1956 and continued each year through the summer of 1979. IBA would sponsor its first All-State Band in 1961 with John Paynter as the guest conductor. The event went to two ensembles, the All-State Band and the All-State Honor Band, in 1980. The first Junior High All-Region Bands were organized in the fall of 1980 at three sites. As interest grew the number of sites was increased to the current twelve. In 1994 the event was renamed the All-Region Honor Band Festival.

The first IBA commission was premiered at the 1988 All-State Honor Band concert with the composer, Robert Jager, conducting. The Association premiered the first junior high commission by John O'Reilly at the All-Region Festivals later that fall. The winter of 1995 saw the first collaboration of the Indiana chapter of the College Band Director's National Association (CBDNA) and IBA to sponsor the Indiana All-Collegiate Honor Band. The group now is formed biannually to perform at the Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference.

In 1999 IBA established a site on the World Wide Web (www). That year the Association also established All-District Honor Bands for students in grades nine through twelve, performing at six sites in the fall of 2000. The first All-District Band commission, by Robert Sheldon, was premiered in the fall of 2005. IBA now commissions at least one new work for concert band each school year.

In 2005, the membership of IBA established the "Ray Cramer Scholarship" a one thousand dollar grant to be awarded annually to a senior member of the All-State Bands who will pursue a career in music. Previous scholarship recipients are:

In 2009 IBA initiated the first Indiana Junior All-State Band for students in grades seven through nine. Their premier performance was held in conjunction with the 2009 Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference. Dr. Susan Creasup from Morehead State University served as the guest conductor. The first commissioned new work for the Indiana Junior All-State Band was composed by Jesse Ayres and premiered in January 2014.
