# 2019 IBA All-State Band Guest Conductor Dr. Jason Worzbyt

Dr. Jason Worzbyt is Professor of Bassoon and Associate Director of Bands at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He holds a B.S. in Music Education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania, a Master of Music in wind conducting from the University of North Texas and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in bassoon performance from the University of North Texas. Dr. Worzbyt has studied bassoon with Kathleen Reynolds, principal bassoon of the Dallas Opera Orchestra and professor of bassoon at the University of North Texas; Kristen Wolfe Jensen, professor of bassoon at the University of Texas; David T. Borst, professor emeritus of bassoon at Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and James Rodgers, principal contrabassoon of the Pittsburgh Symphony. His conducting teachers include Jack Stamp, director of band studies at Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Eugene Migliaro Corporon, director of wind studies at the University of North Texas.

Dr. Worzbyt has performed, recorded and has been featured as a soloist with wind ensembles and orchestras all across the country. These ensembles include the Keystone Wind Ensemble, IUP Wind Ensemble, North Texas Wind Symphony, North Texas New Music Ensemble, Lexington Philharmonic Orchestra, Johnstown Symphony Orchestra, Highland Wind Quintet and the IUP Faculty Woodwind Quintet. In 2001, Dr. Worzbyt gave the world premiere of Bruce Yurko's Concerto for Bassoon and Wind Ensemble with the Keystone Wind Ensemble at the College Band Directors National Association conference. From 2006 to 2009 he was a member of the artist-faculty at the Western Chamber Music Institute hosted by Western State College in Gunnison, Colorado. performances include several recitals at meetings of the International Double Reed Society. In March of 2013, Klavier Records released a compact disc recording (Five in the Sun) by the Keystone Chamber Players of which Dr. Worzbyt is a member. Most recently, Dr. Worzbyt premiered and recorded Bruce Yurko's Concerto No. 2 for



**Bassoon and Wind Orchestra** in October of 2014. During his almost 21 year tenure at IUP, he has performed with many of the regional orchestras in western Pennsylvania, including the Johnstown Symphony, Altoona Symphony, Westmoreland Symphony, and Butler Symphony.

As a guest conductor, Dr. Worzbyt has worked with elementary, junior high, senior high, and professional ensembles in Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, Maryland, Virginia, Indiana, Georgia, and Kentucky. Highlights of these appearances include the Indiana Junior High All State Band, New Jersey All State Symphonic Band, PMEA All State Orchestra, PMEA Western Region State Orchestra, PMEA Region III Band, PMEA Region IV Band, PMEA District 4 and 6 Orchestras in Johnstown and Westmont, PMEA District 2,3,5 Orchestras in Indiana and Purchase Line, and PMEA District Bands in Pittsburgh, York, Berlin, Johnstown, Harrisburg, Punxsutawney and Philadelphia. From 2007 through 2013, he was music director and conductor of the Westmoreland Symphonic Winds, a professional wind ensemble in residence at Seton Hill University. Committed to music education in the state of Pennsylvania, Dr. Worzbyt is currently the Band Content Area Representative for the Pennsylvania Music Education Association. He formerly served as President and Higher Education Representative of PMEA District 3, and continues to serve this organization as an adjudicator, guest conductor, and clinician. He has also authored several study guides for the **Teaching Music Through Performance in Band, Middle School Band and Beginning Band** series published by GIA. Dr. Worzbyt lives in Indiana, PA with his lovely wife Michelle, a Presbyterian pastor, and very active nine year old, Christian James.

### 2019 IBA All-State Honor Band Guest Conductor Scott Teeple

**Scott Teeple,** professor of music, serves on the conducting faculty at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. His duties include sharing responsibilities with the concert band, conducting the wind ensemble, and teaching undergraduate and graduate conducting. During the academic year, he conducts the Winds of Wisconsin, an honors band comprised of talented high school musicians from around the state.

Mr. Teeple is in demand as a conducting clinician, and guest conductor throughout the United States and abroad. He is regularly invited to teach at conducting workshops and lead all-state honor bands. He has conducted the World Youth Wind Symphony at the Interlochen Arts Camp, the American School in Singapore, the IASAS Cultural Festival and the honor band of the International American Schools in Doah, Qatar.

Under his leadership, ensembles have performed with guest soloists and conductors of international renown. On



campus, ensembles have engaged in week-long residencies with guest composers and guest artists including 2011 Pulitzer Prize winner Zhou Long, Grammy Award-winning percussionist / composer Michael Udow, Marianne Ploger. Applied faculty have frequently performed as guest soloists. The UW Band program continues to offer the "Wisconsin Summit," a workshop for middle and high school band directors, featuring guest clinicians from across the country. The Wind Ensemble recently recorded its first CD, and also recorded the "Concerto for Euphonium" by John Stevens.

Before his appointment at the University of Wisconsin, Teeple served on the faculty at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, the University of Michigan—Ann Arbor, and Port Huron Northern High School (MI). He has served on the executive board of the Wisconsin Music Educators' Association and on the Arts Alliance Executive Board, and served as president of the Big Ten Band Directors Association.

Mr. Teeple received degrees in music education and conducting from the University of Michigan where he studied with H. Robert Reynolds. He is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, the National Association for Music Education, and the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles. He is the 2012 recipient of the UW Edna Weicher's Award. Other honors include membership in Phi Mu Alpha, Kappa Kappa Psi, Pi Kappa Lambda and Phi Eta Sigma.

#### 2019 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Bandmaster Mike Pote

Michael Pote was named Director of Bands at Carmel High School in 2013 after serving for 20 years as Associate Director of Bands. The band program at Carmel High School serves nearly 600 students with 6 concert bands, 5 jazz ensembles, marching band, chamber ensembles, private lesson program, percussion ensembles and 3 winter color guards.

Carmel High School's Wind Symphony 1 performed at the 2005 Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic and has been a 4-time participant in the Music for All National Concert Band Festival. Wind Symphony 1 was also named the 1999, 2013, 2015, 2017 and 2018 Indiana State School Music Association Concert Band State Champion. The Carmel band program recently received the National Band Association "National Program of

Excellence" award as well as being a two-time recipient of the

prestigious Sudler Shield.

The Carmel High School Marching Band has been a Bands of America Grand National Finalist for 23 consecutive years dating back to 1996 and were the ISSMA State Champions in 1990, 2001, 2002, 2012 and 2018. CHS is a twenty-two time Bands of America Regional Champion and were named the Bands of America Grand National Champion in 2005, 2012, 2016, 2017 and 2018.

Michael is also active as a composer and music arranger for groups across the country. Concert works by Mr. Pote have been premiered across the nation including, most recently, at the Texas Music Education Association Conference.

Mr. Pote is a 1990 graduate of Murray State University in Murray, KY and lives in Carmel with his wife Gretta, who is Director of Bands at Clay Middle School in Carmel, and his son Devin who is a trumpet player in the Carmel Band Program.

#### Phi Beta Mu

Phi Beta Mu is the highest honorary international band director's fraternity. It was organized to encourage the building of better bands and the development of better musicians in schools throughout the world and to foster deeper appreciation of good music and more wide spread public interest. Gamma Chapter of Phi Beta Mu was organized and the charter members initiated on November 27, 1953, at the state convention of the Indiana Music Educators Association.

## 2019 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame Bill Laughlin

Bill Laughlin was born in 1961 in Los Angeles, CA. Having graduated High School in Roanoke, VA, Mr. Laughlin received a BME from Indiana Wesleyan University (Marion, IN). A "Master of Arts in Education" degree was completed in 1990 from Ball State University. Bill is married to Gayle Laughlin (27 years) who was the assistant band director at Paoli with him for 20 years. Gayle is a 2015 recipient of the Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame award. Extended family includes a son/daughter in law and 2 grandchildren who live in Fishers, IN. Bill & Gayle also have 2 Old English Sheepdogs: Mollie & Rosie.

Bill Laughlin began his teaching career in June of 1983 at Morristown, Indiana. He directed all of the bands (5-12); taught history classes, coached the golf team and directed the senior play. After 5 years, he moved to Paoli Jr/Sr HS in the summer of 1988, beginning his tenure with Gayle as his assistant. While at Paoli, Bill taught all



of the band levels, music theory and music appreciation. After 35 years as Head Director, Bill retired from that position as of July, 2018. Today – Bill still assists with the beginning band program on a part time basis.

While at the Paoli Jr/Sr HS position for 30 years, the band was a consistent State Finalist at the ISSMA Marching Band Championships, earning 12 State Marching Band Championships and 5 Runner Up finishes, as well as participation in Bands of America Regional Events. The JH & HS concert bands were consistent Gold Medal ratings at the Group I level. Through the private lesson program — Paoli students were consistent performers at the State Level of Solo & Ensemble Festival. Educational travel with the Paoli Band Program included 5 appearances at the Philadelphia Thanksgiving Day Parade (& NYC); an 8 day trip to Italy with 3 performances; and various other band trips (Orlando, Chicago). As a staff member of the Indiana's Ambassadors of Music, Bill has taken band & choral students to Europe for a 2 week tour of performances and sightseeing.

Mr. Laughlin has served, and still serves on many musical boards. He is a 3 time president of the Indiana Bandmasters Association (IBA), has served on the State Boards of the Indiana Music Education Association (IMEA) and the Indiana State School Music Association (ISSMA). Bill has served as an Adjudicator for the KY, AZ & UT State Marching Band Finals shows; the KY state finals concert band program; and various regional concert band festivals in IN & KY. Mr. Laughlin has presented educational clinics at the Indiana and Nebraska state conferences, the Midwest International Band & Orchestra Clinic, and at local universities (ISU, IU, IWU). Guest conducting experiences include many Junior High and High School honor bands in IN and KY.

#### **Indiana Bandmasters Association**

#### Purpose

- 1. To stimulate interest in the study of the band and its literature.
- 2. To develop a desire for good band literature.
- 3. To encourage good fellowship between the members of the Association.
- 4. To bring the work of the Association before the Indiana Department of Education and the citizens of the State in order that it shall gain greater recognition and support.
- 5. To provide educational meetings for band directors to raise the standards of instruction.
- 6. To secure recognition of School Administrators and Boards of Education to the effect that the band is an integral part of the school curriculum and is entitled to recognition as a curricular subject.
- 7. To develop a band in each community which shall serve as a vital force in bringing people into closer relationship with the schools of the State.

#### History

Founded in 1953, the Indiana Bandmasters Association would initially engage in sponsoring a Marching Band Clinic, an All-State Band, and act in an advisory capacity for Indiana Music Education Association (IMEA) on band activities. The first Marching Band Clinic was organized in the fall of 1956 and continued each year through the summer of 1979. IBA would sponsor its first All-State Band in 1961 with John Paynter as the guest conductor. The event went to two ensembles, the All-State Band and the All-State Honor Band, in 1980. The first Junior High All-Region Bands were organized in the fall of 1980 at three sites. As interest grew the number of sites was increased to the current twelve. In 1994 the event was renamed the All-Region Honor Band Festival.

The first IBA commission was premiered at the 1988 All-State Honor Band concert with the composer, Robert Jager, conducting. The Association premiered the first junior high commission by John O'Reilly at the All-Region Festivals later that fall. The winter of 1995 saw the first collaboration of the Indiana chapter of the College Band Director's National Association (CBDNA) and IBA to sponsor the Indiana All-Collegiate Honor Band. The group now is formed biannually to perform at the Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference.

In 1999 IBA established a site on the World Wide Web (www). That year the Association also established All-District Honor Bands for students in grades nine through twelve, performing at six sites in the fall of 2000. The first All-District Band commission, by Robert Sheldon, was premiered in the fall of 2005. IBA now commissions at least one new work for concert band each school year.

In 2005, the membership of IBA established the "Ray Cramer Scholarship" a \$1000 grant to be awarded annually to a senior member of the All-State Bands who will pursue a career in music. Previous scholarship recipients are:

In 2009 IBA initiated the first Indiana Junior All-State Band for students in grades seven through nine. Their premier performance was held in conjunction with the 2009 Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference. Dr. Susan Creasup from Morehead State University served as the guest conductor. The first commissioned new work for the Indiana Junior All-State Band was composed by Jesse Ayres and premiered in January 2014.
